UNACCOMPANIED MIGRANT CHILDREN FILM THEIR STORIES

The International Organization for Migration (IOM)-UN Migration Agency and its partners are currently engaged in the work of the Fostering Across Borders (FAB) project (2018-2019), which aims to improve the quality and expand family-based care options for unaccompanied migrant children with dedicated foster carers across six European countries: Austria, Belgium, Greece, Luxembourg, Poland and the United Kingdom.

As part of the project, unaccompanied migrant children residing in Austria explored their experiences of living in family-based care and participated in a series of five filmmaking workshops to create a video on their views. The video is used as a training and awareness raising tool, ensuring capacity building and recruitment activities

maintain a truly child-centered approach. A shorter video was also produced to support the notion that family-based care offers one of the best opportunities to provide a nurturing environment to these children, where their needs can be successfully met; and to aid the recruitment of foster carers to look after them.

FAB is funded by the European Commission and implemented in partnership with Mentor-Escale and Minor-Ndako in Belgium; the Luxembourgish Red Cross in Luxembourg; the Association for Legal Intervention in Poland; and Coram BAAF and Coram Children's Legal Centre in the UK.
