

Migrants are powerful actors of development, and migration is crucial to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals and the 2030 Agenda. The ways that migration interacts with sustainable development (and vice versa) are far reaching, with impacts felt across a wide array of development sectors – including education, health, urban development, and others.

IOM is working in collaboration with the European Commission’s Directorate – General for International Partnerships (DG INTPA) to implement the Mainstreaming Migration into International Cooperation and Development (MMICD) project, running from 2017 - 2022.

A Package of Resources was developed under the project to provide concise, operational, and user-friendly information and tools to help international cooperation and development actors integrate migration into international cooperation and development interventions. These materials, which include [country assessments](#), training workshops and technical assistance to mainstream migration into country strategy documents, were tested in three pilot countries: [Ecuador](#), [Madagascar](#) and [Nepal](#), and informed by the technical expertise of various UN partners.
